

GCSE English Language



GCSE English Language forms part of the minimum entry requirements for a wide range of careers including Nursing, Teaching and the Police Force. Studying this subject will also help you develop your skills and confidence in reading, writing and speaking & listening.

Course duration: 31 weeks (part time)
(3 hours per week)

Price: £811 or FREE if you do not currently hold grade A*-C/9-4 or an equivalent qualification.

What will I learn?

- How to analyse writers' use of language to convey their views, ideas and values. To do this you will engage with a range of fiction and non-fiction writing from the 19th to 21st century.
- How to write in a range of styles for different audiences and purposes. This will include opinion writing in the form of a newspaper article, a speech or letter as well as a narrative or other creative piece.

In order to succeed on the course, you will need to complete 3 hours of study per week in your own time.

How will I be assessed?

There are two exam papers. Both exams are 1 hour and 45 minutes long and test reading and writing skills.

You will also complete one speaking and listening assessment in a friendly atmosphere. Although a course requirement, this assessment will not contribute to your final grade.

What are the entry requirements?

Before you enrol, we will ask you to take a skills check to find out the level you are currently working at. This will allow us to identify if this is the right course for you and provide you with advice and guidance about the most appropriate course of study.

What progression is there?

A GCSE in English Language allows you to progress to a range of higher level studies and careers.
