

## **Entry Requirements**

GCSE English Language, Science and maths at grade A\*-C/9-4. Some Universities require students to have a full UK manual driving licence, with no more than 6 points.

Please be aware that if your long-term goal is to work within the healthcare professions, it will be necessary to undergo a Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check at your place of employment. If you have a criminal conviction this may exclude you from working in some job roles.

## Why should you study at Runshaw?


- We tend to have Guest speakers visiting who are; Adult Nurses, Paediatric Nurses and midwifery students in practice from industry.
