Counselling Studies

This course provides learning experiences which will enable you to develop and practice counselling skills. It will also increase your knowledge/understanding of such skills and look at counselling theories in more depth. It is specifically designed for those who want to take the next step towards training to become a counsellor (having already acquired some counselling skills), or continue their skills development for voluntary work or employment. This level does not qualify you to be a counsellor.

30 weeks.

Learning Method

This course is currently fully delivered in the classroom. This is regularly reviewed.

What will I learn?

This course:

- learn more about agency work and develop an understanding of how an Ethical Framework supports safe practice.
- explore the effects of attitudes and personal value choices brought to the counselling relationship.
- consider issues relating to valuing diversity within ourselves and work situations, including mental health issues.
- increase your knowledge and understanding of person-centred counselling theory.
- explore in general terms how research informs the development of counselling theory and counselling practice.

Entry Requirements

You should have previously undertaken 90 hours of counselling skills training, eg by completing the CPCAB Counselling Skills Level 2 Certificate (CSK-L2) or equivalent. You will also need to have an interview to assess your eligibility for the course.

Applicants need to be able to demonstrate their ability to handle the level of academic work required and show willingness to take responsibility for oneself.

Applicants must be able to respect others regardless of race, ethnic origin, gender, sexual orientation or disability.

- Are aged 19-23 and have not already achieved a full Level 3.
- Are unemployed (and looking for work) and in receipt of JSA, Universal Credit, Child Benefit and Careers Allowance.
- Earn less than £20,319 annually before tax.

If you are aged 19 or over and thinking about studying a further education - vocational, technical or professional course, you may qualify for an Advanced Learner Loan to help you pay your course fees.

You could also either pay in three installments or pay the fee in full.
