Learning Method

Entry Requirements

You should have GCSE Grade A*-C/Grade 9-4 in either Mathematics or English, or an equivalent qualification. If you only have one of these qualifications, you must be willing to undertake the other alongside this course.

This course is a progression route for those who have passed an appropriate Level 2 Teaching Assistant qualification (or equivalent, eg Child Care Learning & Development Level 2) or have had substantial experience in assisting pupils in learning environments, undertaking assessments, supporting behaviour management etc, or an equivalent qualification (e.g. Level 2 Key Skills/Functional Skills/Basic Skills). You will also be required to undertake a minimum of 100 hours work placement in a school or college setting. You should arrange this placement yourself prior to the start of the course.

What will I learn?

By combining practical experience with theoretical learning to encourage both understanding and the development of professional skills, this course supports the current Government initiative to develop the role of school support staff.

Placement experience can be gained within primary, secondary or sixth form settings and maybe in a voluntary or contractually employed capacity.
