Progress Mentors

The role of the Progress Mentor combines the responsibilities of a personal tutor and a pastoral support tutor. All students are enrolled to a Progress Mentor Group and attend a weekly session. The group session provides a channel for two way communications relating to college life. Students will also attend a regular 1:1 session where they will discuss individual action plans and receive guidance relating to A Level study. The Progress Mentor will also support them through any difficult times, and above all, celebrate successes.

The Progress Mentor plays a key part in helping students settle into college. They will carefully monitor progress and help with careers guidance, choosing university courses, study skills and health issues. The Progress Mentor will be the main link person between college and home, we would therefore encourage you to contact them directly if you have any information for us, questions to ask or any concern to raise.
